

## **EVERYTHING FITS PERFECTLY, BUT THERE ARE STILL WRINKLES!!**

*Most fabrics used on outdoor blinds are made using a weaved polyester, coated in a coloured polymer. Basically, this means we should expect it to behave like other plastic type products which we are familiar with. For example, when a skin has spent period wrapped around an axle assembly, it will tend to temporarily set to that shape (this is particularly evident when an installed blind has been left up during cold weather or when a pre-fabricated blind has been packaged for lengthy transit). Like most plastics, a gentle warmth will release the fabric and allow it to straighten back out.*

**Half an hour in direct sunlight will relieve the skin of most wrinkles, however this process can be replicated by using a low setting on a heat gun (or hair dryer) from approximately 400mm away (do not overheat the fabric - a tip is to hold the gun the same distance from the skin as you are capable of withstanding with your hand, to gauge the heat).**
